### Cross-border payments interoperability and extension (PIE) taskforce<sup>1</sup>

Virtual meeting (13.00–14.30 CEST, 11 May 2023)

#### 1. Opening

- The chair will welcome the members and set out the objectives of the call.

#### 2. Taskforce working procedures and draft terms of reference

- The secretariat will provide a brief overview of the cross-border payments programme, the priority actions concerning the PIE taskforce and the draft PIE taskforce terms of reference.
- PIE taskforce members will discuss the draft PIE taskforce terms of reference and the proposed working procedures going forward.

#### 3. Practical actions to realise benefits of the extension and interoperability of payments systems

- According to the G20 cross-border payments roadmap, the PIE taskforce should identify and sequence practical actions to fully realise the benefits of longer operating hours, expanded access, harmonised messaging standards and improved interoperability between payments systems. These actions will feed into a workplan (or “checklist”) going forward.
- PIE taskforce members are invited to identify suitable practical actions, discuss how they can feed into a taskforce workplan, and agree on how to promote and develop broader industry engagement.

- PIE taskforce members will discuss the role of the PIE taskforce in the implementation and governance of the harmonisation requirements upon the finalisation of these in October 2023.
