The Historical Peninsula Tour and Lunch

CBRT will organize a tour to the historical peninsula of Istanbul, around Sultan Ahmed Square. The tour will be followed by a lunch hosted by the Central Bank of the Republic of Turkey (*Location TBA*).


Sultan Ahmed Square had also been the main square of the ancient Constantinople of the Roman Empire. The square was built as a hippodrome in AD 203, where chariot races used to be organised. Today, only a few fragments of the original structure have survived. However, it's been surrounded by many Byzantine and Ottoman monuments since then, two of which are the Hagia Sophia and the Blue Mosque.

Blue Mosque

Also known as the Sultan Ahmed Mosque, it is one of the impressive monuments of Istanbul that has become its symbol. The mosque is also one of the most photogenic Ottoman mosques in Turkey.

Standing in the middle of Istanbul, the majestic Blue Mosque is hard to miss. Being one of the grandest mosques in Turkey, it can hold up to 10.000 worshippers.

The interior is decorated with the finest pieces of blue tiles from Iznik, which is why the Sultan Ahmed



Please make sure you spend some time in silence inside the breath taking mosque to admire its prayerful atmosphere and superb blue tiles.



Hagia Sophia

Hagia Sophia, a remarkable achievement in the history of architecture. A monument whose importance transcends borders. As one of **UNESCO's World Cultural Heritage** sites, Hagia Sophia continues to attract millions with its majestic grandeur and beauty.

Built by the order of Byzantine Emperor Justinian I in the **6th century**, Hagia Sophia, includes pagan pillars taken from Ephesus and the Temple of Artemis and precious mosaics of Christianity and Islam. This great

temple was dedicated to the Holy Spirit (Sophia) in the trinity doctrine of Christianity. Hagia Sophia is also one of the largest cathedrals in the world having special significance for the Orthodox community.

Hagia Sophia is not only renowned for its magnificent religious architecture but also for its superb exquisite Byzantine mosaics and fine examples of unique Ottoman calligraphy.

General Information

Istanbul

Istanbul bridges east and west not only geographically but also culturally. Bosphorus Strait divides Istanbul in two parts and also into two continents: Europe and Asia.

For more than 1.500 years, Istanbul was the capital of two empires, first the Byzantine and later the Ottoman. It was beautified accordingly with magnificent monuments and became a metropolis where diverse cultures, nations and religions mingle.

Today, Istanbul is Turkey's most populous city, with a population of over 15 Million, as well as its financial and cultural hub.

Weather

March sees the end of winter and start of spring in Istanbul. It's still cold (the lowest temperature ever recorded at this time in the region is -6°C) and wet but the weather is gradually beginning to warm up, and there's a marked rise in temperature.

The average temperature is just 8°C, with highs of 11°C and overnight lows of 5°C. However, the temperature would even go up to 25°C, and by the end of the month it will feel much warmer.

Time Zone

Time zone of İstanbul and Turkey is GMT+3.

International Dialling Codes

The country code for Turkey is 90, and the local code for İstanbul is 212. To make an international phone call, dial 00 + country code + phone number.

Currency

The official currency is Turkish Liras (TRY) with the symbol \mathbf{t} (available in the following banknotes: 5, 10, 20, 50, 100 and 200 TL.

Cash can usually be exchanged without commission at exchange offices, banks and hotels. Exchange rates are published daily in Turkish newspapers and can also be found in CBRT web page (http://www.tcmb.gov.tr).

Tipping

Although there is no common practice in tipping, the generally accepted tipping rate is 10% in Turkey.

Smoking

Smoking indoors is prohibited in Turkey.

Electricity

Turkey operates on 220 volts, 50 Hz, with round-prong European-style plugs that fit into recessed wall sockets. Limited number of adaptors will be available at the meeting venue.
